Have you heard about STOP AND WATCH?

This is a tool we use to catch any slight changes in a patient or resident, so we can assess and treat them before something becomes a big problem. Most times, before someone becomes really sick, there are subtle changes that can alert us that something is going on. For example, you may notice that your loved one seems a little more sleepy than normal, or you feel that they are more confused than they were when you last visited. We consider you a partner in the care of your loved one, so when you notice anything different or 'off', let us know. The best way for you to do this is to fill out a STOP AND WATCH form and give it to the nurse. (The forms are located by the door of the patients room, and can also be found at the nurses station.) This alerts her to further assess the patient and to communicate concerns and findings to nursing administration and the Doctor as appropriate. It is always in the best interest of the patient to be treated in the Center, rather than returning to the hospital. If we catch problems early, we are most likely able to avoid a hospital trip that can lead to negative outcomes for your family member.
